Anza Expedition Campsite 101

The plaque (left) located at the foot of the fishing pier marks the spot of the Juan Bautista de Anza Expedition's 101st campsite from Horcasitas, Sonora, Mexico. De Anza brought 198 colonists on his journey northward to the Bay region, located the sites of the Presidio of San Francisco and Mission Dolores for Spain, and explored the extent of the bay. On April 3, 1776, Father Font noted in his expedition diary that from this point he could see the Sierra Nevada to the east, the Sacramento Valley directly ahead, and the Diablo Range to the west.
