Enclosed is your East Bay Regional Park District Metal Detector Permit. This card must be carried at all times when metal detecting on Regional Park lands. It must be presented, upon demand, to any authorized Park District employee or Public Safety Officer for expiration date or name verification. The permit will be **revoked** by East Bay Regional Park District, and the card retained, upon determination that Park Ordinance #38 has been violated, or if it has been determined that physical damage has occurred to park property by the card holder. The permit is non-transferable to any other party.

Metal detecting in the Regional Parks is limited to beach areas, lawns, and other developed park areas. Metal detecting is NOT allowed at Contra Loma Regional Park or in the natural parkland areas, wilderness areas, or regional preserves.

Beach Rules: Metal detecting on beach areas is best done between the hours of 8 - 11 a.m., before crowds arrive. Sifting of sand can occur as part of your metal detecting activities. We ask that you place any metal that has no value to you, glass or other debris found during you activities in a park garbage can. Metal detecting that requires you to enter the water is prohibited.

Lawn or Developed Area Rules: Metal detecting on lawn or developed park areas is limited to discovery and removal of objects on the surface of the ground. Digging or removing plugs from lawns is prohibited. Please place any found debris in a park garbage can.

You should be aware that Section 485 of the Penal Code requires that all finders of items of value must turn such items over to the appropriate police department. When such items are valuable rings, watches, etc., found on Regional Parklands, you should turn the item over to the Park Supervisor or a Public Safety Police Officer. If you leave your name, address and telephone number you can claim the item after 90 days if it has not been identified and claimed by the legal owner. You should contact our Public Safety Department after the 90-day waiting period by calling (881-1833-keeper of property) and verifying the status of your claim.

We suggest that you plan your activities largely in the early morning or evening hours, when your disturbance of the visiting public will be minimized. With cooperation on the part of all, we feel confident that this special use of East Bay Regional Park District property can continue. Happy metal detecting!
