Connections to Long Ago: Living and Working on an 1890s Farm  Get a glimpse into life on an 1890s farm, as costumed Naturalists demonstrate some typical farm tasks. Students will make connections between farms and things they use in everyday life, considering what has changed over time, and what remains the same.	K – I <sup>st</sup>	20 minutes	I class
From Field to Food: How Farms Have Fed Us Through History  Track foods from the field to the dinner plate, as a Naturalist in an 1890s period costume guides your students' exploration of a historic farm. Compare and contrast historical methods of farming and cooking with modern technology as we transform crops into food.	2nd	30 minutes	I class
Cultivating Gold: 250 Years of Farming in California  Trace the evolution of farming in California, while virtually exploring the grounds of Ardenwood. Historic buildings and artifacts, along with maps, photographs, diaries, and other primary sources will help students learn about the people and events that shaped their community.	3rd	40 minutes	I class

Wonderful Wool Students meet our sheep and learn how their wool is turned into clothes we wear. The program explores the processes of shearing, carding, spinning, and knitting wool, with us on wool processing then and now.	2 <sup>nd</sup> — 6 <sup>th</sup>	1.5 hours	l class
