## If You Build It—They Will Come

Ducks that nest in hollow trees?
Wood ducks (*Aix sponsa*) do just that!
Populations of this colorful waterbird plummeted due to habitat loss and overhunting, but conservation has allowed populations to rebound.
Park staff and volunteers provide nest-boxes as alternative nest sites, and monitor their success. It didn't take long for ducks to move in!



## Taking the Plunge

After hatching, the ducklings spend one day in the nest-box. They leap up to the exit and...jump! The fall doesn't harm them, and they rush towards the water's safety.





## Adapted for Tree Dwelling

Wood ducks are small and maneuverable, have large eyes to spot branches in-flight, and have feet for climbing and swimming. Look for these unusual and colorful ducks along streams and lakes.
