AGENDA SUMMARY

Dumbarton Quarry Park – Update

Dumbarton Quarry and Associates (DQA) has begun construction of the sewer main that will connect the future park to the USD sewer system. This work will be ongoing for the next few months pending weather. The storm and water systems will follow after the completion of the sewer, both offsite and onsite. DQA is in receipt and is addressing the most recent comments from the City of Fremont and East Bay Regional Park District. It is anticipated to have the plans submitted to both for review by the end of November 2016.

Mission Peak Regional Preserve - Update
Environmental Impact Report

The District's Board of Directors certified the Environmental Impact Report, adopted the Mitigation, Monitoring, and Reporting Program, approved the "Option A" project, and appropriated Measure WW funds to complete project design and permitting at their regularly scheduled meeting on September 20, 2016. The District's Board of Directors re-approved the Project and adopted Findings at their regularly scheduled meeting on October 04, 2016. The Notice of Determination was filed on October 5, 2016 initiating the 30-day statute of limitations wherein a lawsuit can be filed.

Pilot Residential Parking Program

Fremont City Council introduced an ordinance allowing for a neighborhood to submit an application for a permit parking program on December 15, 2015. The East Bay Regional Park District Board of Directors approved funding for the program on the same day. The neighborhood surrounding the Mission Peak Stanford Avenue staging area brought forward an application and the City of Fremont validated that it complied with their ordinance. May 17, 2016 the Fremont City Council adopted a resolution to create a pilot residential parking program in the neighborhood surrounding the Mission Peak Stanford Avenue staging area. The pilot residential parking program allows for approximately 150 spaces on Vineyard Avenue and Antelope Drive to be excluded from the program, allowing for public parking at all times. These spaces combined with the parking available at the Stanford Avenue staging area allow for approximately 200 spaces available for public use. October 1, 2016 the program was implemented, as a public information phase, with joint administration from the City of Fremont and the East Bay Regional Park District. November 1, 2016 ticket enforcement will begin with both agencies.

Vargas Plateau – Update

Ardenwood Historic Farm– Update

Anne Kassebaum, Chief of Interpretive and Recreation Services, will provide an update on changes in staff positions, recent and near future projects and special programs taking place at Ardenwood Historic Farm. A brief overview of concession operations, projects, and monarch habitat management will conclude the presentation.
