Performs day-to-day administration of the District's software applications and programs; performs a full range of duties that includes working with other departments to gather requirements to create reports from various databases using report writing software tools such as Crystal and Microsoft Access; analyzes and reviews business processes and procedures for potential improvement; address technical issues; acts as lead in major systems installations, application migration efforts, and integration with existing systems; coordinates with user departments to implement conversions and upgrades; prepares and maintains process and report-writing documentation; develops project timelines; works with sensitive data involving District employees; and performs related duties as required.
