

Fire Safety Rules

- Adults must supervise children at all times.
- Keep fire small and keep a bucket of water and shovel nearby.
- Extinguish fires before going to sleep and when you leave your site.
- Pour water on fire, drown all embers and step back to avoid hot steam.
- Stir and turn ashes, coals and wood on all sides.
- Drown and stir again.
- Feel for heat with back of hand to be sure nothing is still smoldering.
- If you feel heat, stir more water into ashes until cool.

Family Camping Regulations

East Bay Regional Park District Ordinance 38

Quiet Hours are from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Maximum Occupancy is eight persons per campsite.

Stay Limit is 15 consecutive days, with a 30-day maximum per calendar year.

Gates are locked at 10 p.m. Opening hours vary by parks.

Fires are permitted only in designated areas. Stoves and charcoal grills must be placed in designated cooking areas. Fires and smoking are prohibited in the event of extreme fire danger.
(See reverse for fire safety rules.)

Motor Vehicles are limited to two per site and must have pink camping ticket in window. There is a fee for the second vehicle. Drive on paved public roads only. Park on paved pad only.

Smoking is prohibited except in overnight campsites.

Alcoholic Beverages other than beer and wine are prohibited.

Pets must be leashed at all times and confined to a vehicle or tent during **Quiet Hours**.
Dog waste must be disposed of in dumpsters.

Fireworks, Weapons, and Firearms are prohibited.

Plants and Animals are protected by law.

Site-Specific Rules may apply at different parks.
Please refer to your camping reservations contract.

Group Camping within the park is by reservation only. Please call (888) 327-2757, option 2.
