ONSITE Programs	Description	Grade	Duration
Creatures of the Bay	Meet residents of the San Francisco Bay. Program includes Old Wharf Classroom “dive,” turning a child into a giant crab, & a guided outdoor nature study.	K-2nd	1 hour
		3rd & up	1.5 hours
Food Chains	Investigate how plants and animals of the Bay-estuary are connected. Participants take a “dive” in the Old Wharf Classroom, build a Bay food chain, & explore outdoors to find real life examples of food chains.	2nd	1 hour
		3rd & up	1.5 hours
Birds Around the Bay (Fall/Spring only)	Learn how birds are adapted to their watery environments. Compare birds of pond, bay, & the parkland. Introduction in the Old Wharf Classroom followed by guided walk outdoors using our binoculars.	3rd & up	1.5 hours
Cove Days (Fall/Spring only)	Visit activity stations with your classes including a “dive” in the Old Wharf Classroom, seasonal guided explorations, nature games on the lawn, a visit to our exhibit area, & more! This 3.5-hour program includes a lunch break and accommodates up to 6 classes.	All grades (multi-class option)	9:30am – 1pm
Bay Laboratory (Spring only)	An in-depth study of Bay-estuary ecology. Explore mudflats and eelgrass beds with the help of seine nets, hip wader boots, microscopes, and mud core samplers. Students learn scientific inquiry skills and carry out experiments during low tide. This 3-hour program also includes a pre-trip visit to your classroom by one of our naturalist staff.	5th & up \$200 fee per class	3 hours + 1 hour pre-trip classroom visit
