**East Bay Skyline National Recreation Trail, Huckleberry Botanic Regional Preserve, Oakland** In 1970, the Park District proposed the creation of the East Bay Skyline National Trail to President Lyndon B. Johnson under the newly signed Trails Act. The Skyline Trail became a 31-mile continuous path, traversing the East Bay hills from Wildcat Canyon to Anthony Chabot.
