Trail Description

The Briones to Mt. Diablo Regional Trail offers sweeping views of Pleasant Hill and Walnut Creek. It passes over Acalanes Ridge into Larkey Park and past the Alexander Lindsay Museum.

The trail shares the right-of-way with the California State Riding and Hiking Trail, as well as the Contra Costa Canal trail, for 1.55 miles. The trail passes by Heather Farm Park, goes through Shell Ridge Open Space and Diablo Foothills Regional Park, then ends at Macedo Ranch inside Mt. Diablo State Park.
