

The Ponds of Brushy Peak

Ponds, especially during dry California summers provide vital water for sustaining life. They are essential for wetland loving plants and animals and provide habitat for federally-protected amphibian species such as the California red-legged frog and California tiger salamander. Any unusual disturbance to the pond could result in loss of wildlife habitat.

This area is part of a resource management zone and is not open to public access. Please respect this ecosystem and watch wildlife from a safe distance. Many animals are attracted to the ponds, and if you are patient, you may even see the rare San Joaquin kit fox.
