



TO REACH DEL VALLE REGIONAL PARK:
7000 Del Valle Road, Livermore, CA 94550
To swim beaches, picnicking, and hiking at the south end: From I-580 in Livermore, exit at North Livermore Ave. Drive south on North Livermore Ave. through the City of Livermore. North Livermore Ave. becomes South Livermore Ave., then becomes Tesla Road outside Livermore. Turn right at the intersection with Mines Road. Follow Mines Road to its intersection with Del Valle Road and follow Del Valle Road to the park entrance.
To the Arroyo Road Staging Area: From I-580 in Livermore, exit at North Livermore Ave. Drive south on North Livermore Ave. Turn right at Portola Avenue, then left on North L Street. North L Street becomes South L Street, then Arroyo Road. Continue on Arroyo Road past the entrance to the U.S. Veterans Administration Hospital and Sycamore Grove Park. The staging area is on the left at the end of Arroyo Road.

HORSES ARE NOT ALLOWED in developed areas, grassy lawn areas, picnic areas, or East or West Beach picnic and swim areas.

Ohlone Trail Sign-in Panel. Permit required beyond this point. No bicycles allowed.

GROUP CAMPS
Ardilla Camp: West side of the lake, past Lichen Bark, 0.1-mile hike, near flush toilets and water. Capacity 50. Hike-in only; vehicles may not be used to transport equipment.
Venados Camp: East side of the lake, 1.5 miles from the boat ramp. Leave vehicles in the parking lot near the concession stand. Capacity 50. Hike-in only; vehicles may not be used to transport equipment.
Hetch Hetchy Camp: This is a large meadow on the east side of the lake about one mile from the boat ramp. Capacity 100. Hike-in only; vehicles may not be used to transport equipment.
Cedar Camp: This camp is about .21 miles from the park's southern entrance road. Capacity 50. Hike-in only; vehicles may not be used to transport equipment.
Wild Turkey Camp: located in the family campground. Stone fire circle in the amphitheater. Capacity 50.
Punta Vaca: located in the family campground. Less developed than Wild Turkey Camp. Capacity 75.
Eagles View: Located on the east side, with adjacent restroom and paved parking. Capacity 50.

 Please enjoy Regional Parks safely and help protect and preserve the parklands by following all park rules and regulations.

- SAFETY**
- Stay on trails. Shortcuts are dangerous and damage natural resources.
 - Bring plenty of water to prevent dehydration.
 - Be prepared for sudden changes in weather conditions.
 - Keep parks clean. Pack out what you pack in.
 - Inform someone where you are going and when you will return.
 - Save our 24/7 Dispatch Center number on your cell phone: Emergency (510) 881-1121; Nonemergency (510) 881-1833.

- RULES**
- Dogs must be leashed in parking lots, within 200 feet of any trail or park entrance, in picnic areas, developed areas, where grazing animals are present, and as posted. Dogs must be under voice control at all times. Clean up after your pet: bag it, bin it.
 - Bicycles are permitted on designated trails only. Bicyclists stay to the right

- side of trail, ring or call out when passing.
- Bicyclists yield to pedestrians. Both yield to equestrians.
- State law requires that all bicyclists under age 18 wear a helmet. All bicyclists and equestrians are encouraged to wear helmets at all times.
- Class I e-Bikes are allowed on all trails where regular bikes are allowed, and Class II e-Bikes on all paved Regional Trails.
- **DO NOT attach or tie anything to trees, including hammocks and swings.**
- The following are prohibited:
 - Wading and/or swimming in undesignated areas
 - Consuming alcohol in non-designated areas/parks
 - Feeding or approaching wildlife
 - Releasing animals into parklands
 - Causing damage to plants or geological or archaeological features
 - Graffiti
 - Smoking/vaping
 - Skateboarding
 - Flying drones

Visitors are responsible for knowing and complying with park rules (Ordinance 38). See ebparks.org/rules.
